

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Student Uses for Discovery Education Board Builder

Board Builder is a tool that is designed for collecting, organizing, using, and presenting information from a variety of different media types, including text, images, video, audio, and documents. When creating boards, students are able to use their creativity to share what they've learned with their teachers, peers and the Discovery Education Community. Student-specific uses for Board Builder are endless. You'll find a few examples listed below:

Get to know your students by having them create "Get to Know Me" (https://app.discoveryeducation.com/player/view/assetGuid/gEA25B83-0700-4EE5-BDD0-A23CFFACBF24) boards that contain pictures, videos, and text that describe characteristics that make them unique. Presenting these boards to the class gives students an opportunity to tell a little about themselves and gives the teacher a chance to gauge their public speaking and technology skills.

Set up opportunities for independent learning

Give them something fun to research over a Spring or Summer break, or provide differentiated content for students that is appropriate to their specific needs.

Assign students the task of creating a board that teaches other students (https://app.discoveryeducation.com/player/view/assetGuid/F2EC4B07-OB01-46A3-9794-A58EA8386F8D) about a novel. Have them include background information on the author, key vocabulary in the text and character information. Extend this activity by asking students to film a mock author interview (with a student standing in the author). Students can then become teachers, using their board to teach their peers about the book.
